



Plants

flower	contains the reproductive parts of the plant
# flower	produces seeds
* stem	holds the plant up
stem	carries water and nutrients from the roots to the leaves
leaves	contain a substance called chlorophyll
leaves	produce food for the plant
roots	hold the plant in the ground
roots	absorb water and nutrients from the soil





Key Vocabulary

Flower- The colourful part of the plant that holds the reproductive parts and holds the pollen. The flowers may have petals.


Stem- This holds the plant up and it carries water and nutrients from the roots to the rest of the plant.

Roots- They hold the plant in the ground and are below the surface of the soil. They also absorb the water from the soil.

Evergreen trees- Trees that keep their leaves (green) all year round e.g. fir tree.

Deciduous trees- Trees that lose and regrow their leaves in different seasons e.g. oak tree.

Some examples of plants/flowers: bean, daffodil, dandelion, rose, daisy, lavender, grass.



Key Vocabulary


Jesus- Christians believe that he is the son of God and was sent to save humans from the sins they had committed.

Christians - people who follow Christianity and believe that Jesus is the son of God.


King- a male ruler of a country.

<u>Colour</u>

The **Primary** colours are three colours that cannot be made by mixing other colours. These colours are **red**, yellow and blue.

When **primary** colours are mixed they make **secondary** colours.



Sculptors and Modelling

A sculpture is a 2D or 3D piece of art that has been carved, chiselled or modelled into something like a statue.

Modelling is how we use our hands and tools to create something using abstract and mathematical thinking.




Key Vocabulary

Scale: The size of objects and shapes compared to each other.



Texture: The feel or look of a work of art.

Line: A mark that can vary in length or shape. Lines can be curved, straight, thick or thin.



Composition: The layout of artwork/objects.

<u>Shade:</u> to darken (an area of a drawing, painting, or the like) by drawing many parallel lines or by filling in with a dark or somewhat dark colour.



Tint: where an artist adds a colour to white to create a lighter version of the colour.



Key Artists

Historical Artist- Auguste Rodin

Born on the 12th of November, 1840, Auguste Rodin was a sculptor, his works are distinguished by their stunning strength and realism. Rodin refused to ignore the negative aspects of humanity, and his works confront distress and moral weakness as well as passion and beauty. His sculptors can be made from clay or bronze. He lived in Paris for most his life, travelled across Italy and Brussels to draw inspiration for his art.



Contemporary Artist- Anthea Hamilton

Born in London in 1978, Anthea Hamilton is famous for her big installations. She creates strange, surreal artworks that we can step into and wander around. She uses lots of different materials and techniques. Performance, sculpture, painting, video, fashion design ... whatever works best to express her ideas.



Key Vocabulary



Algorithm - It is a set of rules or instructions that has to be followed to be able to complete a task or problem.

Sprite - A moving object that can be seen on a computer screen that follows instructions given.

Programming block - These are a set of instructions that tells the computer what you want it to do.

Command - A set of instructions

Programme - A set of instructions that have been set and run by a computer or robot to complete.

Animation - A moving object seen on a computer screen.
