Message from the Head Teacher

Welcome back after the half term break. The children worked very hard on their Top Ten Holiday Homework and produced some lovely work.

Next week we are looking forward to the return of the Book Fair – details can be found further on in this Newsletter.

We have two dress up days planned in the next few weeks. Science Day will take place on 1st March. We have lots of exciting activities planned including a return visit from Fizz Pop Science who are coming in to conduct a variety of workshops such as: What an Earth, Show Me the Light and Crazy Chemistry. We would like the children to dress up as scientists for the day, or even wear something as simple as a long white shirt as a lab coat or some goggles.

The 7th March is World Book Day – an annual highlight! Activities planned include special assemblies, creating a reading den and making a class scrap book. On this day children and staff are asked to dress up as a character from a book. This can involve a little or a lot of effort – the choice is yours!

We are asking for a £1 donation per child on each day. The money collected on Science Day will be used toward the costs of the workshops and the money collected on World Book Day will be used to buy new books for our school library.

I am aware that this is the third time this year we have asked parents to make a contribution to a dress up day. This is an opportunity for you to formally meet your child's class teacher in one of the school halls and discuss their progress and any concerns either party may have.

For parents new to the school, we hold two sets of parent evenings, one in the Autumn term and another in the Spring term. The Autumn parent evenings focus on how your child is settling into class, their targets, their learning behaviour and engagement levels and any areas which the teacher has already identified as requiring intervention or assistance. The Spring parent evenings will focus on your child's academic progress towards their end of year targets. Additionally an end of year report is sent to parents in the last week of the Summer term, which encompasses all those areas together with your child's teacher report, the pupil reflection report, attendance and where appropriate, key stage assessment results.

You will shortly receive a notification of your Parents Evening slot. (Split families will be able to book two separate slots.) Please note that each appointment slot is ten minutes long. We would ask parents to limit discussion to the time allocated, as it is unfair to both the teacher and other parents if appointments over-run.

The Book Fair is Back!


We are delighted to announce that the Book Fair is returning to Cranford Primary School next week. Children and parents will be able to purchase high quality books at low prices using cash or card.

Applications for Nursery 2024 are now open

Children born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 can start in the nursery class of our school in September 2024.

Children can take up a free 15-hour place and working families who meet certain eligibility criteria can also claim an additional 15 hours of free education and childcare a week - 30 hours in total. You can check your eligibility here.
