Message from the Head Teacher

We are proud to have been formally recognised by the Department for Education as a 'Trained Early Career Mentor' school for our work developing our newly qualified teachers. As you know we have a long history of developing young and new teachers here at Cranford and the mentor team are instrumental supporting their learning and progression, developing and strengthening their skills and helping them to promote a healthy work-life balance.

Next Thursday as part of our Eco Schools mission we will be participating in Earth Hour by switching off all lights, computers and gadgets for one hour to show symbolic support for the planet and to raise awareness of the environmental issues affecting it.

Easter is fast approaching. This year I have set an in-class competition for all children with an Easter Egg prize for the winners. This replaces our traditional Easter Bonnet competition as we did not want to burden parents with the time, cost and energy of creating a bonnet, especially after World Book Day and Science Day.

Pebbles the therapy dog

Some lucky children from Year 4 were introduced to Pebbles the dog this week. Pebbles is a therapy dog - trained to provide affection, comfort and support to people, often in settings such as hospitals, retirement homes, nursing homes, schools, libraries, hospices, or disaster areas. However Pebbles came to our school to help children understand more about dog safety for example when and how to approach dogs.

During the visit the children were allowed to stroke Pebbles and then were shown some tricks she has learnt including waiting, spinning and even playing 'dead'. They were taught never to approach a dog without first checking with their owner if the dog is friendly.

The children loved meeting Pebbles – even those who were a little nervous of her to begin with. Anaya and Mariam, from Indigo, were both anxious before meeting Pebbles but after seeing her and speaking to Mr Whitfield, Pebbles' owner, they felt calm and relaxed and joined in with petting and playing with her.
