Message from the Head Teacher

Welcome back after the Easter holidays. It is lovely to see all the children back in school refreshed and ready to start the Summer term. The Summer term is always a very busy one but an enjoyable one too. The children in Year 2 and Year 6 are all working hard in advance of their SATS tests and we have lots of exciting sporting events, performances and school trips coming up. It is very important therefore that you read these weekly newsletters and make a note of all the important diary dates listed on the reverse of this Newsletter as children get upset if they miss something or come to school in the wrong clothes for example.

This week we have had a Challenge Partners peer review. Challenge Partners is an education charity, led by practitioners, through which schools collaborate to improve each other and the education system as a whole, so that all children benefit. The reviewers left us shortly after lunchtime today and it will be a while before we receive our full report but the verbal feedback we have received has been very positive and encouraging. They commented on the school's ethos of love and safety. They called the school a peaceful haven allowing pupils to be themselves and flourish. Thank you to the parents and governors who came in to speak to the Challenge Partners – your input was very valuable. We will of course share the report with you when we receive it.

Yesterday I shared the Code of Conduct for parents with you all. This short policy sets out the standards of behaviour we expect from all visitors to our school. While I appreciate that the contents of the policy – good manners, respect and courtesy – are behaviours demonstrated by the vast majority of our school community we do have isolated incidents of road rage, pushing, bad language etc which we would like to eradicate. - Allergy awareness week gives the chance to raise awareness about allergies, whilst also highlighting the impact on people's lives.
- Allergy UK wants to highlight that the incidence of allergies is now #toobigtoignore.
 - 1 in 2 people will have an allergy by 2026.
 - #1 reported UK health condition in 2022 was allergy.
 - 154% rise in hospital admissions in the last 20 years, due to anaphylaxis.
 - The UK is currently in the top three for highest incidence of allergy and top two for the highest incidence of allergic eczema.
