Message from the Head Teacher

Welcome and well done to our Nursery and Reception children who have settled in brilliantly and completed lots of learning already. We are proud of them all for completing their first week at Cranford Primary. I have also given out several Headteacher's tokens this week for great work – so well done to Dilveer, Toby, Sufyan and Azaan – keep up the hard work.

On Wednesday we had a fire drill. This is done at least once a term to ensure that children are all aware of the steps they need to take in case of a real fire. I like to carry out the first fire drill early on in the term so that the children understood the new exit routes. When the alarm sounds children follow the teacher's instructions to exit the building by the nearest fire exit and gather in the allotted space on the school playground where the teacher carries out a roll call. Simultaneously, our fire wardens have specific duties which they undertake as soon as the fire alarm sounds – these duties include closing doors and windows and checking toilets, group rooms, and cupboards.

Yesterday the fire alarm went off at 2.29pm. By 2.33pm the school was fully evacuated. When the children were back in class all of the teachers spoke to the children about why we practice the fire drill, the importance of following instructions, keeping ourselves safe etc.

I hope this provide you with reassurance that the school is following very robust evacuation procedures and that the children understand the importance of following instructions during evacuation drills.

Since the start of the term there has been some intermittent disruption to our telephone lines. Our IT team investigated and found there was an external problem which we believe has now been resolved. Going forward parents should remember that we can always be contacted by email as our emails are monitored throughout the day. Alternatively come into the office or send a note with your child and one of the team will get back to you.

Today you will have received a 'Knowledge Organiser' – this is the 'go-to' document outlining all of the essential knowledge that the teachers will be covering across each unit of work including dates, key personnel, vocabulary, definitions and other important information. Knowledge Organisers remind the children what they are learning and help them see the bigger learning journey as they continually revisit and retrieve prior learning from their memories. Please refer to these with your child - they will assist in homework tasks and improve your child's knowledge around all of the learning being taught in school.

Hounslow School Nursing Service National Eye Health Week - Vision Matters

Next week is National Eye Health Week which promotes the importance of good eye health and the need for regular eye tests for all.

NHS sight tests are free for all children under 16 years old. Some eye problems are difficult to fully correct if they are not found early. The sooner an eye problem is found, the sooner your child can get treatment and help. An NHS sight test will tell you how well your child can see, and how healthy their eyes are.

Hounslow children in Reception Class are offered free vision screening by the Hounslow School Nursing Service.
