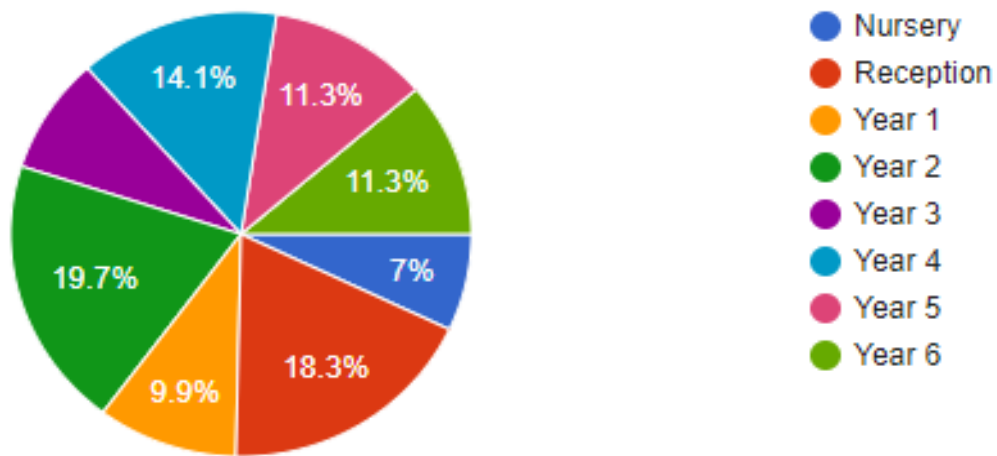


Parent Survey 2023-24 Evaluation

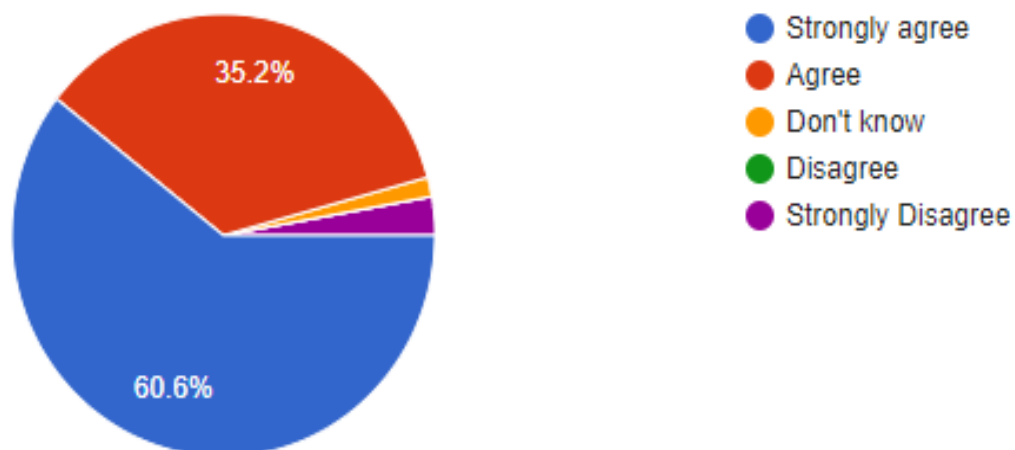
We received 71 responses to our parent survey –this is significantly less than the 162 parents who responded to our January 2024 survey.

The responses to this survey were split relatively evenly across the year groups – see table below:



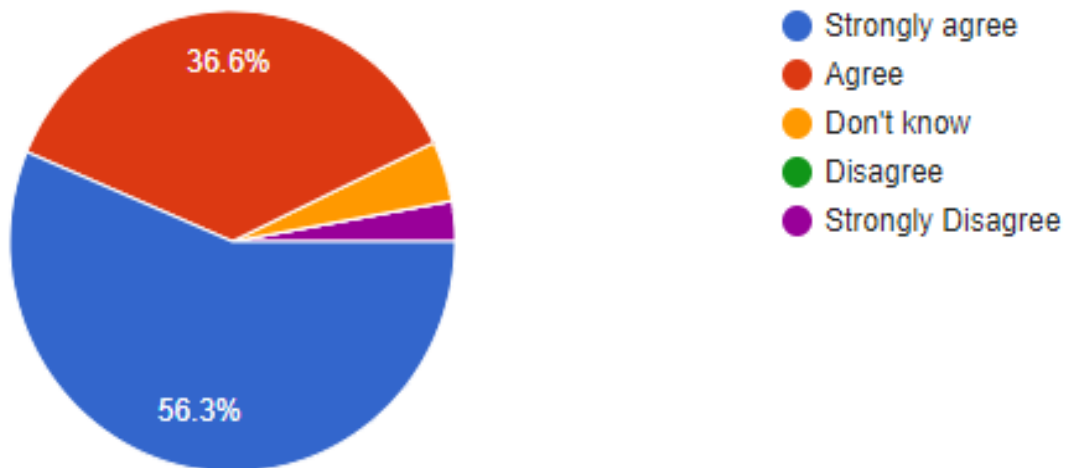
Question 1 - My child is happy at school

95.2% of parents feel that their child is happy at school. 2.7% of parents strongly disagree with the statement. This equates to two responses and one of those responses is from a child in Nursery whose name does not appear on our register.



92% of parents say that their child feels safe at school. Again two disagree with the statement and 4.2% of parents do not know.

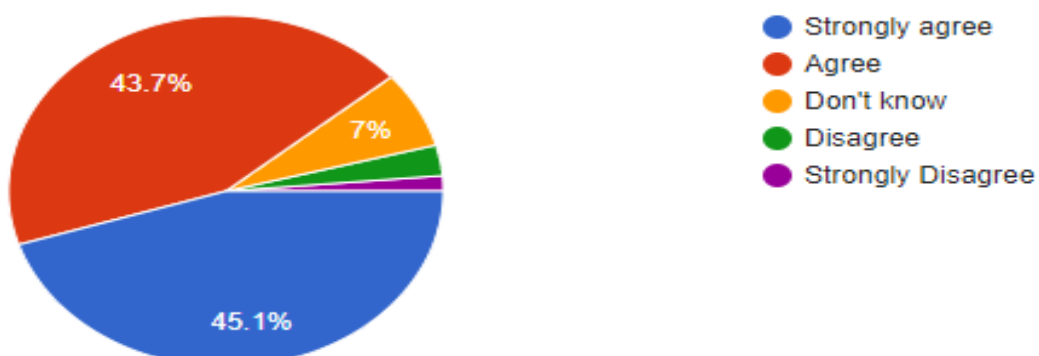
Action: As a school we will continue to work with children to remind them of who they can talk to if they have worries or concerns about school and we will continue to reinforce the children's rights with them.



Question 3 - My child knows who to speak to if they are upset or unhappy at Cranford Primary School

7% of parents say that they do not know if their child knows who to speak to and 4.2% say that their child does not know who they can speak to if they are upset or unhappy.

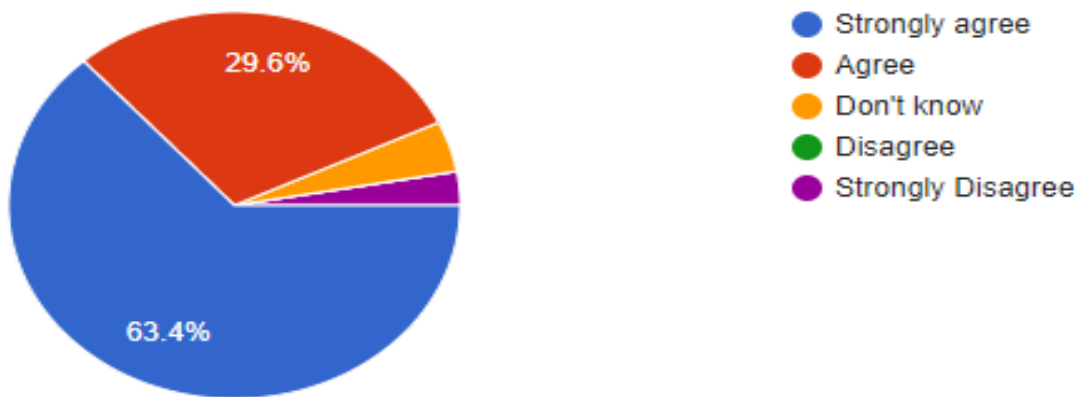
Action: Have a session at the beginning of the year to discuss who children can go to if they need support. Hold assemblies to remind children who they can speak to and also put messages in Newsletter so parents know who their child can speak to.



Question 4 - The teachers are supportive of my child

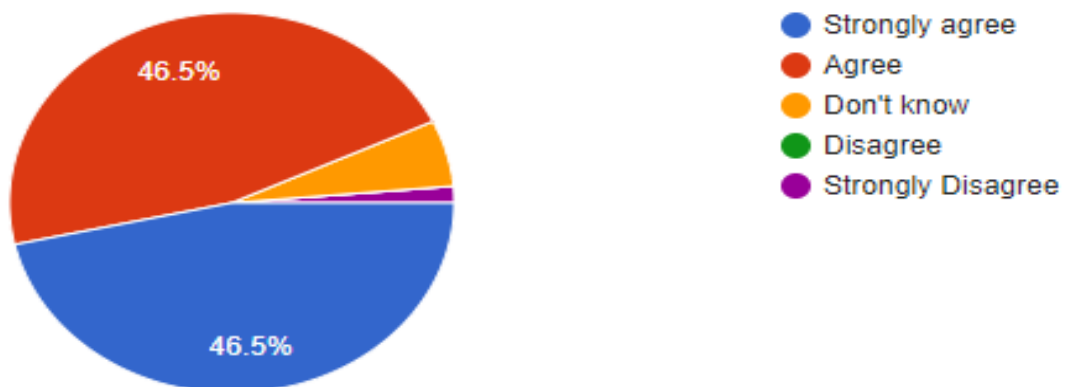
93% of parents think that the teachers are supportive of their child. This means 7% of parents do not know or do not agree which is very disappointing as we know that our teachers do all that they can to support and develop the children's learning, social development and emotional needs.

Action: Strengthen the relationships between teachers and parents through regular contact next academic year.



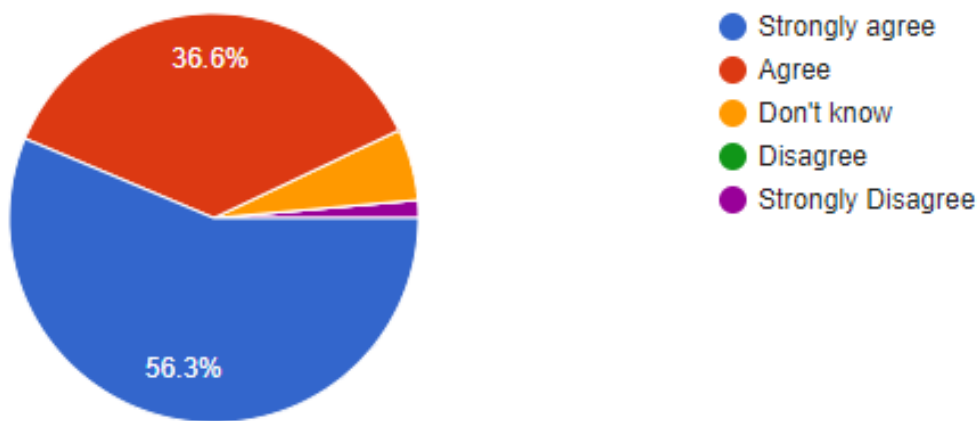
Question 5: The Curriculum at Cranford engages my child in their learning

This is a positive result with over 93% of parents answering positively.



Question 6 - The lessons at Cranford Primary School help my child to learn and progress with their studies.

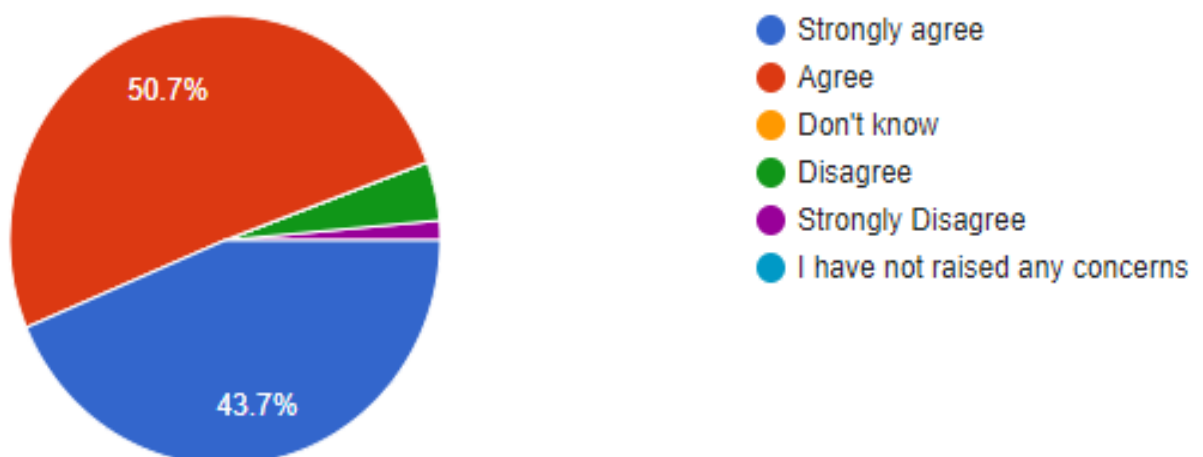
Over 92% of parents agree/ strongly agree with this statement. However, we hope that when the children’s school reports are released parents will fully understand this question better and see the link between the lessons here and their child’s progress.



Question 7 - If I have concerns, the school responds quickly and effectively and I know who I can talk to.

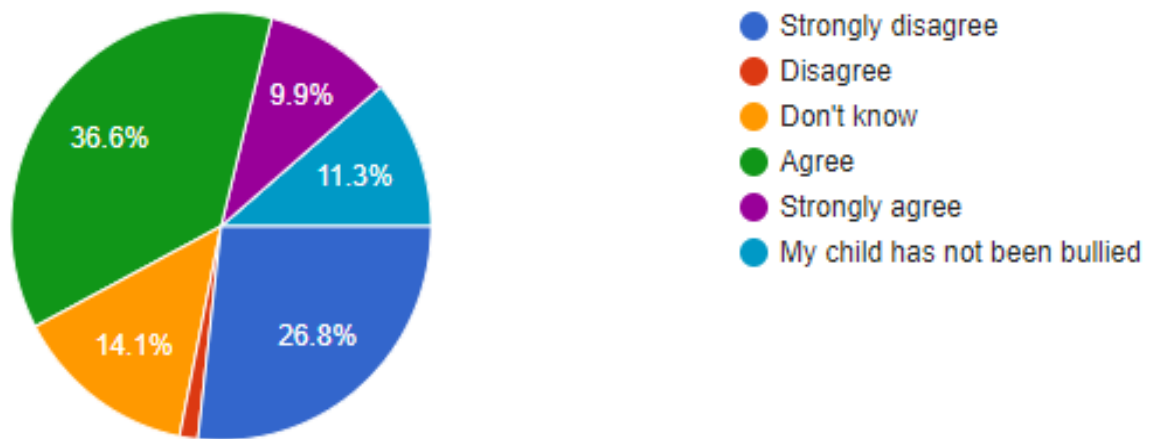
94% of parents agree with this. However 4.2% of parents strongly disagree which is disappointing as the SLT make a point of always responding to parents requests for meetings quickly – usually on the same day.

Action –Remind parents of our open door policy through the newsletter.



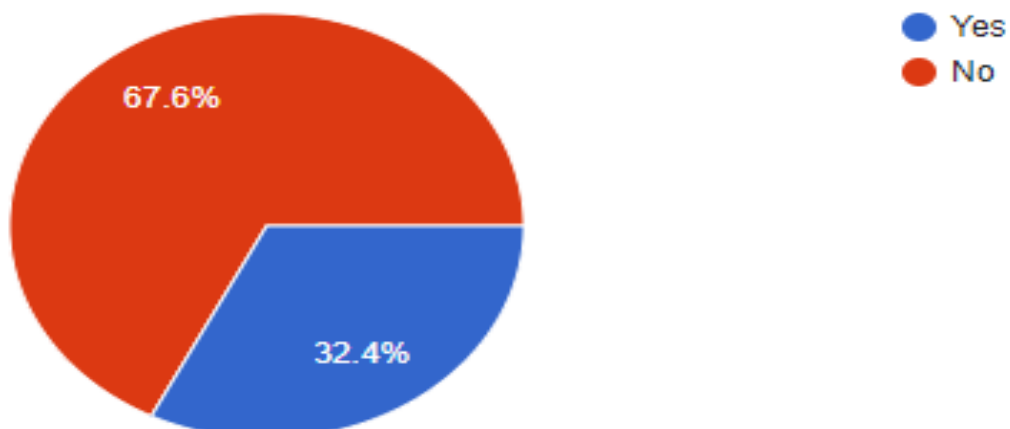
Question 8 - The school deals with any incidents of misbehaviour or bullying in a timely and effective way.

There was a wide spread of responses to this question as shown in the table below. This is reflective of the responses shown in previous parent surveys. When we have looked into this in the past parents feel that incidents are not dealt with but actually they have been but we as a school do not, or cannot, communicate this is because it is sensitive information relating to another person's child.



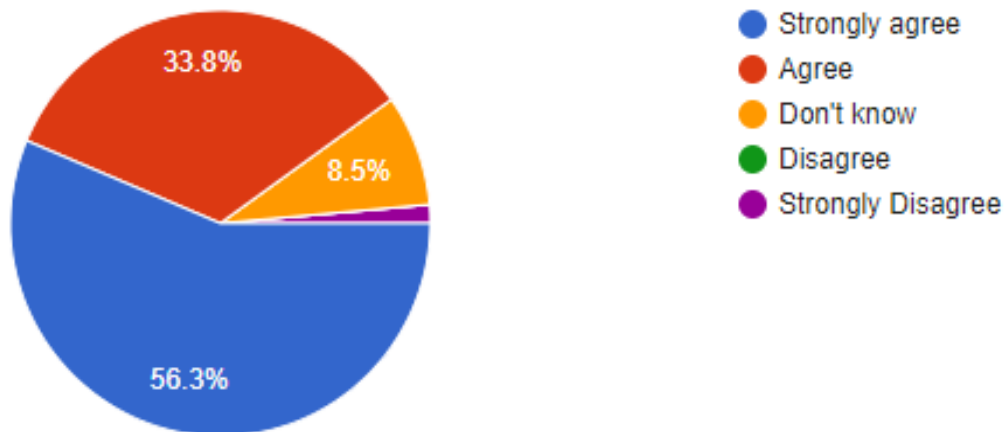
Question 9 - Have you attended one of our coffee mornings or family learn sessions?

Nearly a third of parents who responded have attended one of our family events which is very good. The school aims to increase this percentage for next year.



Question 10 – I feel welcome at Cranford Primary School

This is an extremely positive score with 90% of parents feeling welcome. 8.5% of parents do not know if they feel welcome which is concerning – the school will continue to work on its caring, welcoming approach to all visitors to the school.



Question 11 - I would recommend Cranford Primary to another parent

2.8% of parents who responded (ie 2 people) said they would not recommend our school to another parent – one of these responders has entered a fake child's name. This is therefore a positive response.
