Message from the Head Teacher

I have decided to reduce the cost of Breakfast Club to £4 with effect from Monday 2nd October to help support parents during this tough financial time. Breakfast Club is a fantastic way to prepare pupils for the start of the school day. Open from 7.45am every morning, breakfast club welcomes pupils from Reception to Year 6. Pupils have access to a healthy breakfast, including cereal, toast, fresh fruit and juice. Breakfast club is run by an experienced staff team headed by Mrs Shah. Application forms are available from the office.

Friday 13th October is History Day with this month's theme being *Legends of Time* which will link to Black History Month. Each class will focus on a significant black person through time, learning about their achievements and what makes them special. This day will be an off timetable day with children taking part in a range of fun activities and then presenting their learning to the other classes in their year group. We encourage children to dress up for this day as a 'Legend of Time'. This could be a historical figure or someone who is a legend to them.

We have noticed that quite a significant number of children are not using Google Classroom to complete their homework. Please be aware that going forward paper homework will only be provided to children in exceptional circumstances as agreed by myself. We want to move away from providing paper homework for a variety of reasons. One reason is that paper and printing costs are high and as a school we are looking to make savings wherever possible. There is also an environmental impact to using paper which doesn't support our campaign to become an Eco School. Finally we believe that learning to use platforms such as Google Classroom teach children life-long learning and gives children the skills to support twenty first century life and prepare them for learning in Secondary School.

We ask that all parents encourage the use of Google Classroom at home.

If you need access to a computer or help on how to access the homework please come into school and speak to Miss Khabra, Miss Begh or Miss Davies who will be available to support you.

On Friday 13th October we will be celebrating Legends of Time day which will link to Black History Month.


For this, each class will be focusing on a significant black person through time, learning about their achievements and what makes them special.

Anaphylaxis Awareness Week

1st-7th October 2023



Anaphylaxis Awareness week is all about empowering people with the right knowledge and building confidence to help safely manage serious allergies.

Anaphylaxis is a life-threatening allergic reaction that requires emergency treatment. It can be caused by things such as food, medicine or insect stings. Reactions usually begin within minutes and rapidly progress but can occur up to 2-3 hours later.

Any one or more of the following symptoms may be present:

- AIRWAY swelling in the throat, tongue or upper airways (tightening of the throat, hoarse voice, difficulty swallowing).
 - BREATHING sudden onset wheezing, breathing difficulty, noisy breathing.
- CIRCULATION dizziness, feeling faint, sudden sleepiness, tiredness, confusion, pale clammy skin, loss of consciousness.
- It may also involve symptoms such as: a red raised rash (known as hives or urticaria)
 anywhere on the body, a tingling or itchy feeling in the mouth, swelling of lips, face
 or eyes, and stomach pain or vomiting.

If someone is experiencing anaphylaxis call 999 for an ambulance. If they have an adrenalin auto-injector pen this needs to be given – into the muscle in the outer thigh.

Medicine in School

Written consent from parents must be received before administering any medicine to a child at school. Medicines will only be accepted for administration if they are:

- Prescribed to that child
- In-date
- Labelled
- Provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and include instructions for administration, dosage and storage.

The exception to this is insulin which must be in date but will generally be available inside an insulin pen or pump, rather than in its original container.


Please bring all medicines to the main office – do not hand to the class teacher.

Parents of children currently in Year 6 must apply for their children's secondary school place by 31st October 2023. The online application portal is already open so please do not delay. If you are not sure how to apply please come and speak to the office staff at your earliest convenience. If you do not apply by 31st October it is highly unlikely you will get a place at your child's preferred school.
