


- Bacteria** – Small living things that can be found in the environment.
- Bones** – Hard white tissue that makes up the skeleton for humans and some animals.
- Blood vessels** – Transport blood around the body.
- Carbohydrates** – A group of foods that provide energy to the body, e.g. potatoes and pasta.
- Dairy** – A group of foods that provide calcium to help grow strong teeth and bones.
- Diet** – The food and drink you eat on a daily basis.
- Exercise** – Body movements that get your blood pumping faster around your body.
- Fats** – A group of foods that help store energy in the body, e.g. chips and chocolates.
- Flexibility** – The ability to bend and twist the body without causing injury.
- Fruits** – Sweet foods that come from trees or plants and contain a seed, e.g. strawberries and oranges.
- Germs** – A type of bacteria that can cause illnesses in plants, animals or humans.
- Healthy** – When you are healthy, you are not ill. Things that are healthy are good for you and keep you fit and well.
- Heart rate** – The speed of your heartbeat.
- Hygienic** – Actions you can take to keep you healthy and stop you from getting ill.
- Muscles** – The strong parts of your body that you use to make your body move.
- Proteins** – A group of foods that help build and repair the muscles in your body, e.g. fish and nuts.
- Pulse** – The rhythm of your blood flowing around your body.
- Stamina** – The ability to keep doing something for a long time.
- Vegetables** – The leaves, stems, roots, or other parts of certain plants that people eat, e.g. lettuce and spinach.

Act- when you act, you do something.

Key Vocabulary

United Kingdom: a country in western Europe that is surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean. It is divided 4 areas which are called; England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

London: The capital city of the United Kingdom.

Heathrow Airport: the second busiest airport in the world.

Streets: a public road in a city, town, or village, typically with houses and buildings on one or both sides.

Map: a representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities and roads.

Detached: A house that is not attached to any other buildings.

Semi-detached: A house that is attached to one more house or building.

Bungalow: a low house having only one floor.

Cottage: a small house or habitation without land.

Flats: a low rise or high rise building divided into small apartments.

Terrace: a house built as part of a continuous row in a uniform style.

Caravan: a vehicle equipped for living in, typically towed by a car and used for holidays.

Information Technology- a computer or something that works with computers. A way of storing, retrieving and sending information

Devices- a thing made or adapted for a particular purpose. E.g. a machine or piece of equipment. For example an iPad to research information.

Information- Facts provided or learnt about something or someone.

Purpose- The reason for which something is done or created. What is it used for?

Safely- In a way that protects anyone or anything from danger or harm.
