



Forces & Space

Centre: The point that is in the middle.


Magnetic: Able to be pulled towards a

magnet.






Dinosaurs

Fossil: The remains of an animal or plant that have been left in the rocks for a very long time.


Mary Anning: A famous fossil hunter and collector. She found and identified many pre-historic fossils from the time of the dinosaurs.

Bethlehem – a small town 8 km (5 miles) south of Jerusalem.

This is where Jesus was born in the Christian story.

Key Vocabulary



Algorithm - A precise, step-by-step set of instructions used to solve a problem or achieve an objective.

Debugging - To find and remove errors from computer hardware or software.

Instructions - Detailed information about how something should be done or operated.

Program - An algorithm that has been coded into something that can be run by a machine, e.g., a computer or a robot.

Command - An action such as left command.

Route - A path an object or thing takes to get somewhere.
