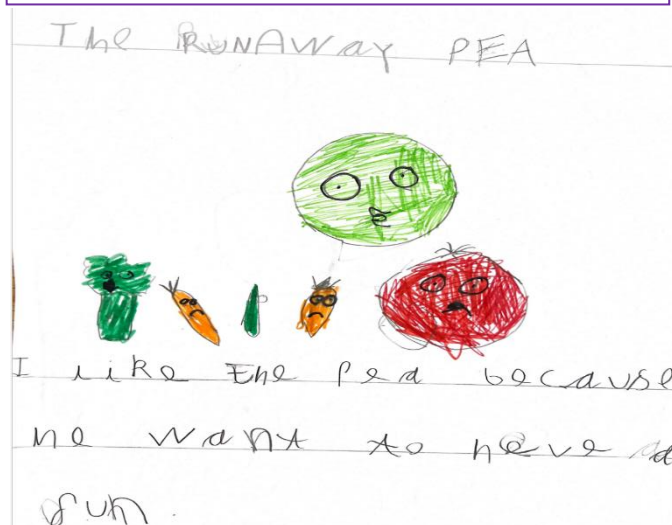

What is your favourite dessert?

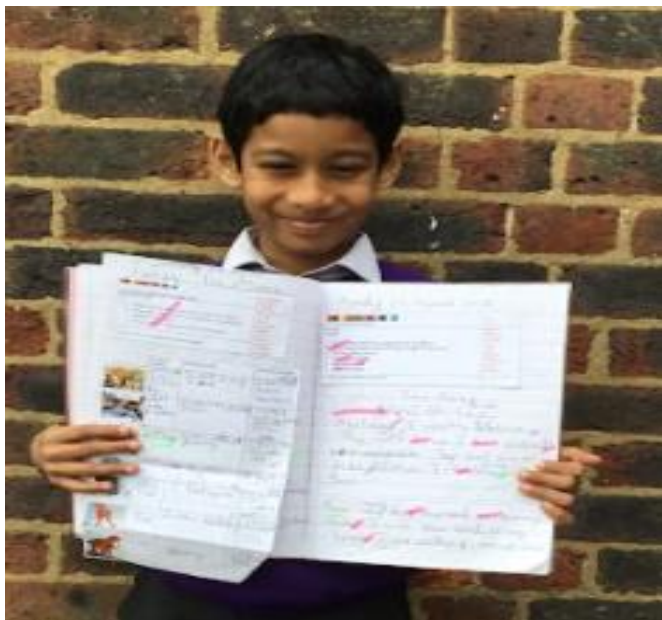

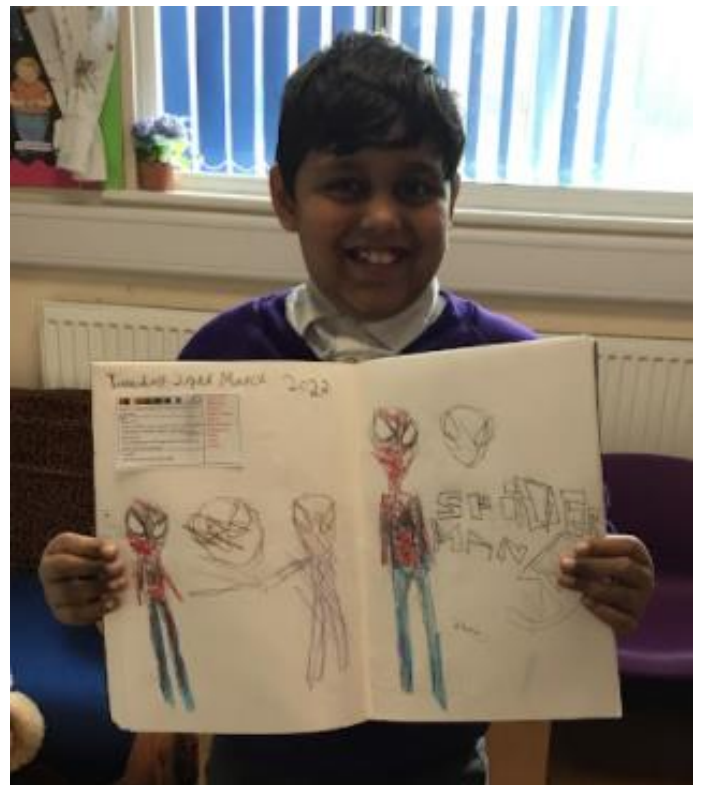

There were around 25 students in a class.

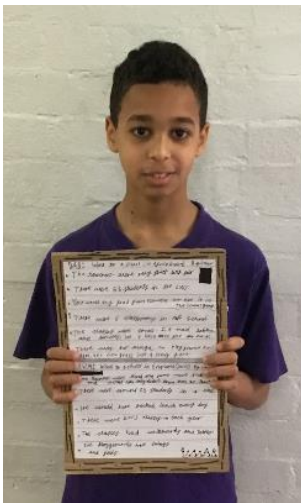
She would have packed lunch every day.

The classes had whiteboards and tables.

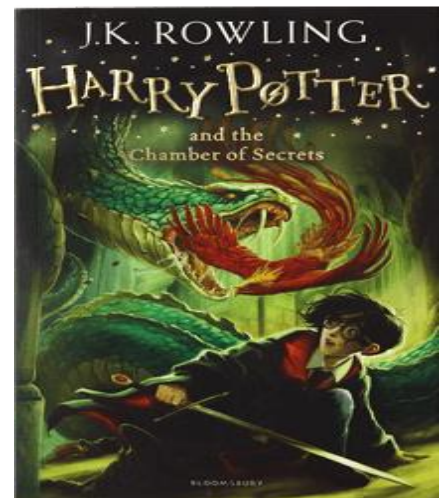
The playgrounds had swings and fields.

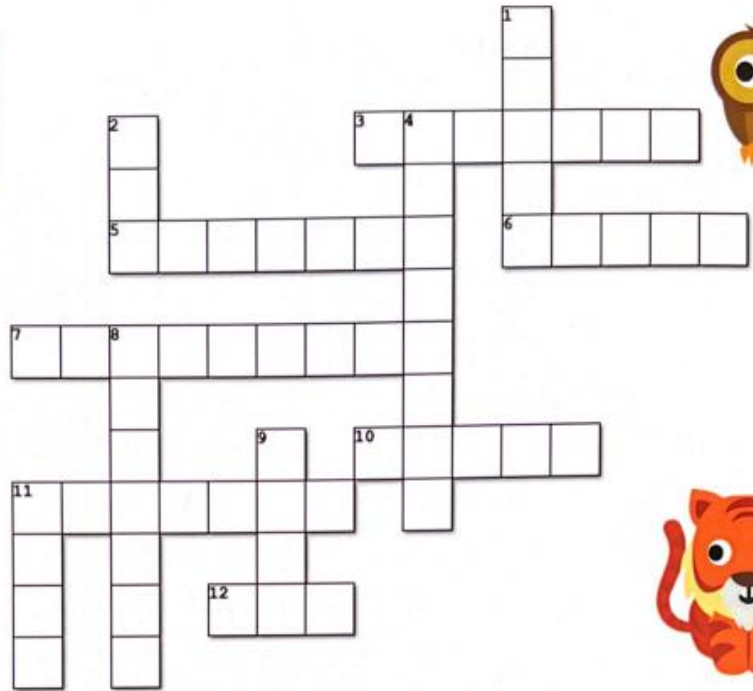
