


Parent Survey 2024

The results of the Parents' Survey carried out in December 2023/January 2024 are attached below. Thank you to the 162 parents who took the time to complete this annual online questionnaire which aims to capture the views of our families about our school.


Questions 1 and 2 : My child feels happy and safe at school

These results are excellent with **96.6% of parents** believing their children to feel happy and safe when in school. These results evidence that our rigorous safeguarding procedures are being implemented consistently by staff throughout the school. It also reflects the fact that our children understand their rights through our participation in Unicef's Rights Respecting Schools programme. They understand that they have a right to feel safe, a right to learn and a right to relax, play and join in a wide range of activities. The children, and adults in our school, learn about the children's rights together and put them into practice every day.




Question 3: My child knows who to speak to if they are upset or unhappy at Cranford Primary School

The positive response to this question is encouraging with nearly 90% of parents saying that their child knows who to speak to if they are upset or unhappy at school. We will, however, keep reminding the children who to approach if they are upset or unhappy so that hopefully by the next time we do a survey we have a 100% positive response. For your information the children are told to speak to their teacher, teaching assistant, any of the school's leadership team – ie Mrs Chana, Miss Khabra, Miss Davies, Mrs Santa or Mrs Wathudura or any other adult especially people such as Miss Begh and Miss Wilde.



Question 4: The teachers are supportive of my child


Again this response is encouraging. Our teachers work hard to plan and teach wellstructured lessons which impart knowledge and develop understanding. Children are supported by the teachers through knowing when and how to differentiate appropriately, using approaches which enable pupils to be taught effectively, having a secure understanding of how a range of factors can inhibit pupils' ability to learn and how best to overcome these and by demonstrating an awareness of the physical, social and intellectual development of children, and know how to adapt teaching to support pupils' education at different stages of development



Question 5: The Curriculum at Cranford engages my child in their learning


Over 96% of parents are confident that our curriculum is good and that their children enjoy their learning. This is extremely encouraging as one of our key priorities has been to develop our curriculum to be a 'KNOW MORE' curriculum designed to take into account our pupils' starting points and their previous learning experiences unlocking potential for all. Our curriculum celebrates the diversity and utilises the knowledge, skills and cultural wealth of the community while supporting the children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. We provide inspirational opportunities to acquire, develop and apply a broad range of knowledge, understanding and skills. We have a commitment to providing our pupils' with a broad and balanced curriculum, where progressive high expectations are at the forefront of all we do.

Our school have gained the understanding that knowledge is embedded over time. Knowledge and understanding is clearly outlined in age-appropriate milestones, building on prior learning to meet the National Curriculum and beyond. We ensure our pupils are given opportunities to recall and remember different concepts to enable progression and attainment. We want our pupils to be confident knowledge sharers who are able to use their transferable skills now and later in life and this seems to be reflected in the parent's views of their child's learning.



Question 6: The lessons at Cranford Primary School help my child to learn and progress with their studies.


Over 98% of parents agree that the lessons at Cranford Primary School help their child to learn and progress with their studies. Our teaching and planning of lessons ensures that children progress with their learning. The teachers are continually assessing the pupils and interventions are put into place to ensure all pupils make progress.



Question 7: If I have concerns, the school responds quickly and effectively and I know who I can talk to.


We aim to respond to all concerns from parents in a timely manner and will usually deal with issues on the same day they are brought to our attention. However parents should be mindful that teachers are busy and that their focus has to be on teaching the children so on occasion may not be able to see a parent immediately. If a safeguarding issue is raised a member of the leadership team will deal with it as a matter of urgency.

If I have concerns, the school responds quickly and effectively and I know who I can talk to. ¹⁶² responses




Question 8: The school deals with any incidents of misbehaviour or bullying in a timely and effective way.

Similarly to the last question, the school aims to respond to any incidents of misbehavior or bullying in a timely manner and will usually deal with issues on the same day they are brought to our attention. It is important that parents work alongside the school to address any incidents of misbehaviour. Many parents commented on the positive reinforcement approach having a good impact on their child's behaviour.




Question 9: I feel welcome at Cranford Primary School
