Project 1 All About You!	My Favourite Things Project Create a project about a topic of your choice! This could be a powerpoint, poster, speech or anything else you can think of! Your topic can be anything you like.
Project 2 Well-being	Well-being Spend 5 minutes a day completing calm activities. This could be reading, colouring, word searches or anything else you find relaxing.
Project 3 Writing	Poetry Create a poem using poetic features about year 4.
Project 4 Topic	All Around The World Create a 3D model of a Earth!
Project 5 Maths	Create a Maths Poster Design a poster that explains a maths concept that you have learnt in Autumn 1. This could be about rounding numbers, subtraction, division, addition or multiplication.
Project 6 DT	Shell Structures - Gift Boxes Create a spooky packaging to put a pumpkin in! This could be made from a shoe box, cardboard, create a cube net and cut it out.
Project 7 Reading	Reading Reflection Choose a book to read over the half term and write a reflection. Your reflection can include a brief summary of the book, who your favourite character is and what you liked most about the book.
Project 8 Computing	The Internet Create a fact file all about the internet!
Project 9 PE	Circuit Create an exercise circuit for you and your family to complete. This could include star jumps, push ups, sprints etc.
Project 10 Science	Living Things and Their Habitats Create a 3D model of an animal's habitat. E.g. A polar habitat for a Polar Bear or a desert habitat for a Rattlesnake.
