## Message from the Head Teacher

Our World Book Day celebrations took place yesterday and were a great success, as usual. We saw some fantastic costumes from children and staff! Please have a look at the pictures later on in this Newsletter.

I have noticed that a small number of children are persistently late to school in the mornings. Perfect punctuality is essential for ensuring your child achieves their full potential. Being late for school has many negative consequences - children feel stressed and embarrassed when arriving to the classroom when everyone else is already settled in. When one pupil arrives late it disrupts the teacher and the rest of the class, compromising everyone's learning. You may be surprised to know that children start learning the minute they get into their classroom. So if your child is late they will miss significant learning opportunities. For example, Reception classes have their fifteen minute phonics lessons first thing in the morning so if your child is late to Reception they will miss out on that vital learning and will fall behind in their reading and writing. Please can parents ensure that their children arrive at school in plenty of time. If your child starts school at 8.40am try and get here five or ten minutes early so that they are relaxed, happy and ready to start their day. This will instil good habits in your child for when they start their working lives. We all know from personal experience that it is much better if we arrive for work in good time, relaxed and in the right frame of mind ready to start our day. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Please do not leave your children unattended in the car parks. While we do try and limit the number of vehicles moving around in the carparks during pick up and drop off times it is still not safe for children to be running around or on their scooters.

Parents Evenings for all children takes place on the 10th March and 12th March. This is an opportunity for you to meet formally with your child's class teacher to discuss their progress and raise any concerns either party may have. You will also have an opportunity to look at your child's Maths and English books. If you are yet to do so, please use the google link provided to book your preferred time slot – the sooner you book, the more likely you are to secure your preferred time slot. If you have any questions regarding the booking system please come and speak to the office, or to your child's teacher.

Please note that each appointment will last 10 minutes and will take place in the two school halls. We kindly ask that parents keep to the allocated time, as it would be unfair to both teachers and other parents if appointments overrun.

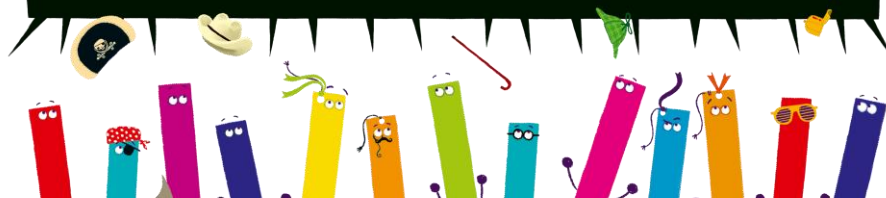

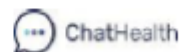

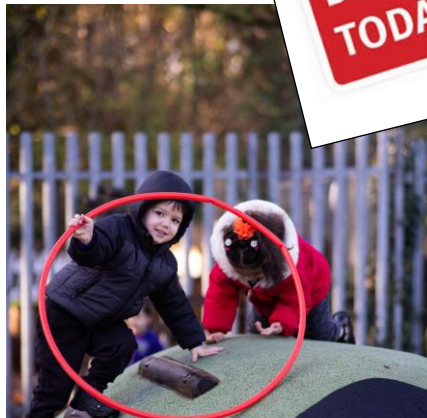
## Apply for a place at our School Nursery
