


Dear Parents and Children,

Remember to take care and look after yourselves.

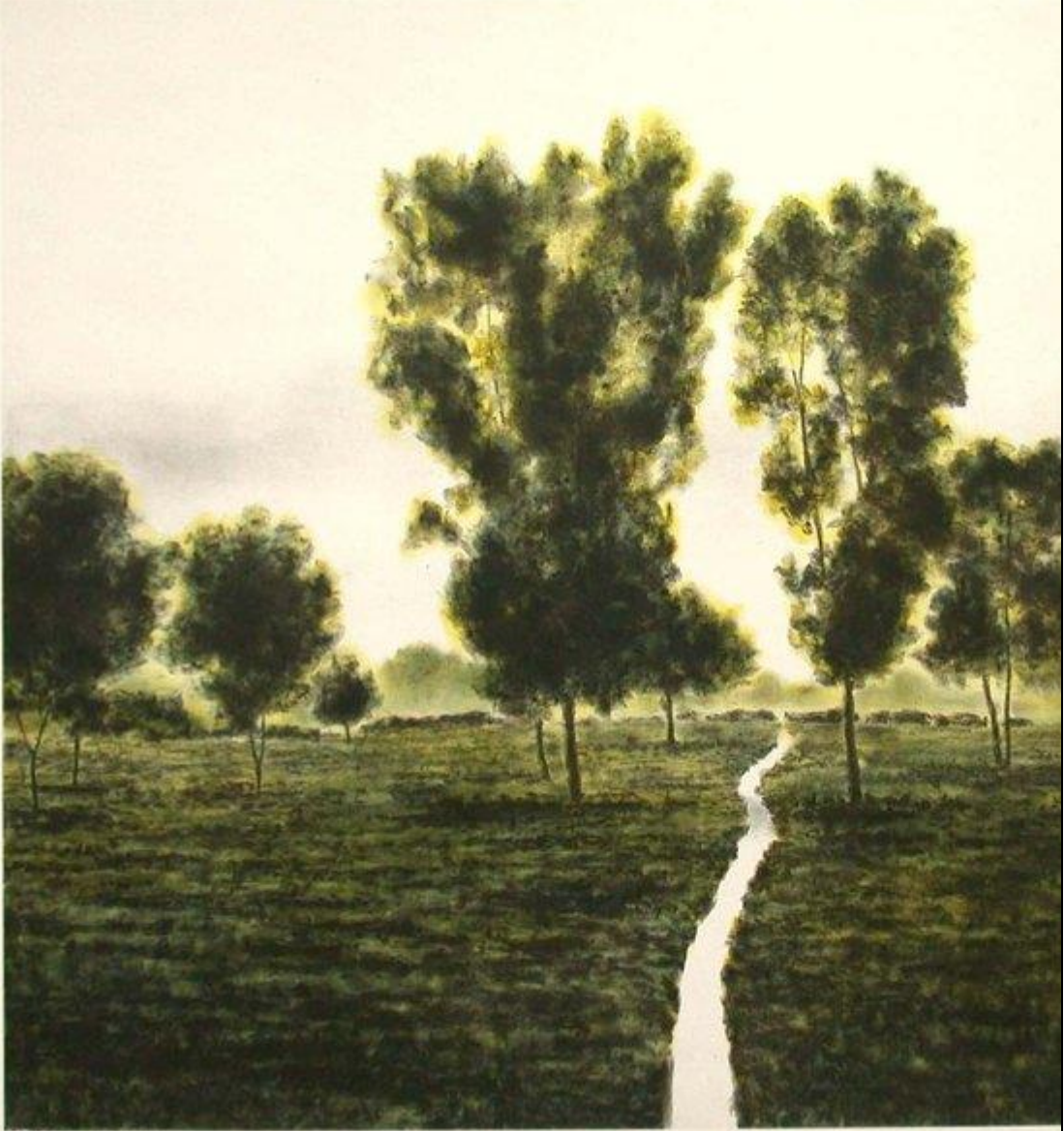
From your Year 2 teachers 😊

Project 1 Science	<p>Science: Next half term in Science we will be learning about living things and their habitats. Pick an animal of your choice, identify which habitat it lives in and investigate why it has chosen this habitat rather than a different one. You should present what you have discovered in a poster, make sure to include lots of facts! Example Question: Why does a polar bear live in the arctic instead of a desert?</p>	 <p>The poster is titled "Polar bear Facts" and features a central drawing of a polar bear's head. Surrounding the drawing are several facts: "Polar Bears live near the North Pole", "They are excellent swimmers.", "Polar bears can smell so well that they can sniff a seal 20 miles away!", "Polar Bears are the largest kind of bear on our planet.", "A thick layer of blubber under their fur keeps them warm.", "They can swim for a very long time. Sometimes they take rests on the ice.", "Polar bears eat seals, fish, reindeer and seabirds.", "Their fur is oily so water won't stick to it and their fur dries really fast.", "They have translucent fur which looks white because of the reflection of the snow."</p>
Project 2 Maths	<p>Maths- Practise solving number sentences from all four operations- including 2 digit numbers. Addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. Get your adult to write down some number sentences for you.</p> <p>Continue to practise your times tables.</p>	
Project 3 RE	<p>RE- Next half term in RE we will be looking at Islam and the importance of a Mosque. Visit a Mosque or if you can not watch this video clip which will teach you about mosques https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GWi7plHFJl8</p>	
Project 4 History	<p>History- Next half term in History we will be completing a local history unit and looking at the differences in Hounslow now and in the past and what has changed in terms of houses, shops and schools etc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Take a walk down the high street, or local area and draw a plan of the area and label it. This way we can see what Hounslow is like now before we compare it to the past.• You could even take a photo of yourself in the local area!

Project 8 Cooking

Cornflake Easter Cakes -

Ingredients -

- 50g butter
- 100g milk for dark chocolate broken into chunks
- 3 tablespoons of golden syrup
- 100g cornflakes
- 1 bag of chocolate mini eggs
- 12 cupcake cases

Method -

1. Weigh out all of the ingredients.
2. Put the butter, chocolate and golden syrup in a saucepan or microwavable



bowl.

3. Put the cornflakes in another large bowl
4. Melt the butter, chocolate and golden syrup in the saucepan over a low heat or briefly in the microwave.
5. Allow to cool for a little before pouring over the cornflakes.
6. Stir the ingredients together gently using a wooden spoon.
7. Spoon the mixtures into 12 cupcake cases and place a mini egg on top of the cornflake mixture.
8. Put in the fridge to set.

4. Paint your design onto the cardboard, using your pencil marks as guidelines.
