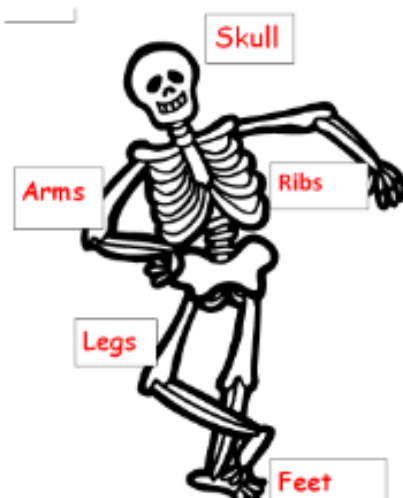

Skeleton: The bones of the body that form a framework.



Bones: Made of connective tissue, reinforced with calcium and bone cells. Bones provide support for our bodies and help form our shape.

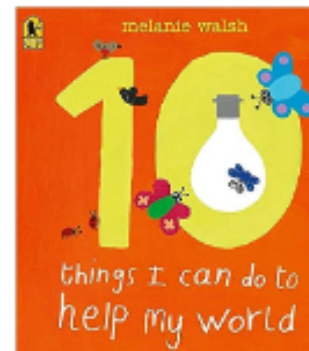

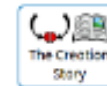

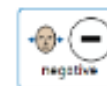

Imagined Compositions: Drawing

Colour

The Primary colours are three colours that cannot be made by mixing other colours. These colours are **red, yellow and blue**. When primary colours are mixed they make secondary colours.



Landscape Paintings

A landscape painting or drawing refers to an artwork whose primary focus is natural scenery, such as fields, mountains, forests, cliffs, trees, rivers, valleys, etc.

Mixed Media- using a mixture of media and processes.

***Medium-** 'singular' refers to one material an artist uses to create artwork.

Key Vocabulary

Scale: The size of objects and shapes compared to each other.



Texture: The feel or look of a work of art.

Line: A mark that can vary in length or shape. Lines can be curved, straight, thick or thin.



Composition: The layout of artwork/objects.

Shade: to darken (an area of a drawing, painting, or the like) by drawing many parallel lines or by filling in with a dark or somewhat dark colour.



Tint: where an artist adds a colour to white to create a lighter version of the colour.



Key Artists

Historical Artist- James Ensor

Born in Belgium on the 13th of April, 1860, James Ensor was a painter and printmaker, an important influence on expressionist and surreal artwork. He lived in Ostend for almost his entire life, only leaving to attend an Art Academy in Brussels and for three brief trips to Paris, London, and Holland.



Contemporary Artist- Peter Doig

Peter Doig was born in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1959. His family moved to Trinidad (West Indies) in 1962, and they moved to Canada in 1966. Most of Peter Doig's paintings are landscapes, and many draw on his childhood experiences of growing up in Canada's snowy climate.

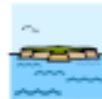
Capital city- The city where the Government building is.

Map- A diagram of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities and roads.



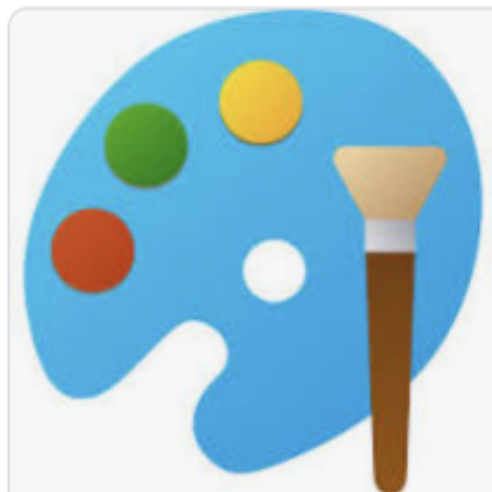
